#2 in nation in math

Bassett 4th grader Christopher Elliott prevailed over 1.2 million students to become the second-ranked student in the nation by solving more than 136,000 math problems during the schools year in the First in Math Online Program.

The program is based on the 24 game series that helps children sharpen basic math skills, such as computational fluency, problem solving, number sense and critical thinking. Students earn electronic awards stickers for correctly solving problems of increasing difficulty.

Christopher is the number one ranked fourth-grade player in the United States. He earned a spot in the First in Math Hall of Fame. This academic year, Westlake students cumulatively solved more than 3.6 million math problems on the First in Math site.

WHS French students earned several top awards in the 76th annual Grand Concours, a national competition sponsored by the American Association of Teachers of French.

Students were evaluated on their written, oral and listening comprehension skills in French. More than 100,000 students in all 50 states competed in the 2011 event. WHS participants are students of Joy Horvath, Nicolette Miller and Elizabeth Zingales.

Le Grand Concours is a 60- minute national test designed, written, financed and disseminated by the members of the American Association of Teachers of French. Its purpose is to help stimulate further interest in the teaching and learning of French and to help identify and reward achievement on the part of both students and teachers.

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2011 National Spanish Exam results

Claudia Vagos' Level 1 LBMS Spanish students attained national recognition for excellent performance on the 2011 National Spanish Examinations. Students earned a total of three gold, nine silver and seven bronze medals, as well as 16 honorable mentions.

Two LBMS students – Melissa Karpuska and Vishal

Shah – landed in the top 3% in the nation, scoring higher than 97% of the students who took the exam. They will receive gold medals. Dominic Cristiano was a top finalist, scoring in the top 5% in the nation, earning a score higher than 95% of the 32,926 students who took the exam. He also will receive a gold

medal.

The nine silver medalists scored higher than 85-94% of students who took the exam. Seven bronze medalists scored higher than 80% of exam takers.

The National Spanish Examinations are given in annually in grades 6 to 12.
