Westlake High School senior Ishaan Bakhle and sophomore Aswin Bikkani each scored a perfect 36 on the ACT test taken last spring. Fewer than 1/10th of 1 percent of the average 1.6 million students who take the ACT earn a top score of 36. This is the seventh time in five years a WHS student has earned a perfect score on the test.

Ishaan participates in the student television station WHBS, and is a member of WHS Student Council and Key Club. His favorite subjects are math and science. Ishaan is considering studying aerospace engineering and is looking at Purdue University, Case Western Reserve University, the University of Cincinnati and Massachusetts Institute of Technology among his college choices.

Aswin is a member of the Speech & Debate Club, National Forensics League, and Academic Challenge. He is on the WHS Track team, and will complete his Eagle Scout award later this year. Aswin is considering the medical field for his post-graduate studies.

The ACT is taken by high school students and college-bound individuals. The scores results are used by colleges for admission, course placement and advising purposes, and by states, districts, schools, teachers and students for diagnostic, monitoring and intervention purposes
