MASTER FACILITY PLAN PHASE I REPORT

- 1. Treasurer Mark Pepera presented a financial report on the building project to date.
- 2. Initial design development for WHS and schematic design for LBMS presented to Board.
 - a. Dr. Keenan would like to spend time at next work session to decide which of two designs to go with. Concept A has 3 entrances, 515 parking spaces (down from 625 right now), would require additional traffic control assistance, safe walking site for students, separates bus/parent traffic. Concept D has 1 entrance to student/parent lot, dividing from staff/bus lot, 551 parking spaces. Matt Hills, site consultant, and Turner or TMS will be at the meeting to address questions.

DIRECTOR OF BUSINESS AFFAIRS REPORT

1. Approached one year ago by LLK Innovations on website advertising. Now called Scholastic Sponsors Association. Eight clients in NE Ohio with website ads that rotate on our site. They host the ads, we simply have a link. The Board indicated a desire to examine sample advertising policies. Potentially could see \$800 - \$1,000 monthly revenues. Funds will be dedicated to technology. Dr. Keenan indicated he would see the web advertising would begin unless objected. No one objected.

1. Tom Mays congratulated Dr. Keenan who received an award from the PTA at Founder's Day. He skyped into the event from an educational conference he was attending out of town that day.
