Statement made by Ms. Rocco:

"Since I was first appointed to the Board of Education in 2001, it has always been my objective to serve the children who attend the Westlake public schools and the community as a whole. It's not an obligation I take lightly. I appreciate the support and confidence of the Westlake community in re-electing me to the Board in November. I feel I have an obligation to those voters to find some way to allow me to continue to serve in my capacity as a board member.

Because of some restructuring in the city law department, there has been a reinterpretation of the state statute regarding service on a board of education. I contacted my state representative to see if the Legislature was aware of the local consequences of this interpretation change. To that end, HB 455 was introduced to clarify any ambiguity and to permit any employees of a law department to also serve on the local school board.

My goal is to continue to keep my job within the city law department and serve the community by being on the school board. It is my hope that the Legislature will choose to clarify the application of this statute.

If at any time the process of resolving this issue has a detrimental affect on the kids of the Westlake Schools, I will take appropriate action. I want to pledge to the community that I will continue to support the levy efforts and work on behalf of kids."

<u>Beal</u>: Updated the Board on the levy committee functions to date. The next levy meeting is on January 17, 2006 at Porter Library.

<u>Board</u>: Discussed holding a retreat. The possible date for the retreat is March 4, 2006 from 8 a.m. until noon.

- -- to provide to members of the professional and support staff as perquisites plaques and other similar memorials to recognize exemplary and extended service to the school district and appropriate refreshments for curriculum, professional development, orientation, in-service and other similar meetings that are held outside of the normal school day or outside of the normal workplace.
- -- to apply for grants under the guidelines of each grant application and authorize the district's participation in the programs including but not limited to: Title VI-B Flow-Thru, Preschool, Title VI, Drug-Free Schools, Eisenhower, and Title VI-R and the Consolidated Local Plan.

- -- to sign all contracts of employment approved by the Board of Education.
- -- to authorize releases for the purpose of interscholastic athletic eligibility.
- -- to approve reimbursement of commercial driving license fees for transportation employees consistent with negotiated contract.
- -- to authorize the payment of reasonable taxes for approved purchases or expenses when a tax exemption certificate cannot be used or its use is impractical under the circumstances.
