1. WTA Agreement

Board Discussion:

Superintendent Keenan began the discussion with highlighting the new terms of the labor agreement with the WTA. Members of the Board commented they were appreciative of the cooperation between the parties and acknowledged the sacrifice from the teachers in achieving a settlement that will better position the District for a levy effort this Spring. They also commented that the terms of the agreement were necessary to uphold their commitment of maintaining the educational program in addition to changing the way the District does business. Mr. Cross noted the District's fiscal reality dictated the results obtained from the new contact and also complimented his colleagues for staying the course in the process.

2. Discussion on Spring Operating Levy

Mr. Mays began the discussion with a reminder that the Board had been discussing an operating levy for several months pending the outcome of the recent labor negotiations. He then asked Superintendent Keenan and CFO Pepera to comment on any recommendation they had with respect to placing a levy on the ballot. Dr. Keenan and CFO Pepera recommended the Board conduct a community survey to help gauge support for an operating levy in May. They both went on to say that assuming the survey is positive, and assuming no change in school programming or levy cycle, the amount of the millage would be similar in range to the last levy passed seven years ago in 2006. Superintendent Keenan went on to say that Cathy Axcell would step forward to chair the levy campaign should the Board move forward with a ballot issue this Spring. All members of the Board indicated that the fiscal situation of the District warrants a levy but that it is also critical to survey and gauge community support. Mr. Cross mentioned his concern on timing and the pros and cons of going on the ballot in the Spring versus the Fall. Dr. Keenan said he would communicate that concern to Triad Research but would defer to their expertise in developing a statistically valid survey. Mr. Mays then asked Dr. Keenan to provide a summary of ballot frequency of neighboring districts.
