#### B. Board Discussion

### 1. Superintendent Vacancy

• Rob Delane, search consultant from the Ohio School Boards Association, facilitated a discussion with the Board on the superintendent vacancy.

<u>Beal</u>: He asked what items or attributes the Board should include in their vacancy posting to peak interest in potential candidates.

<u>Delane</u>: He commented the level of support in a community is very important. Prime examples of district attributes candidates look for are: levy history, bond issues, district facilities, and the local housing stock.

<u>Rocco</u>: In an effort to be more inclusive, she indicated the Board should consider a weekend opportunity for some of the focus groups to meet.

<u>Beal</u>: He indicated any positive or negative notes on candidates derived from the screening committee would be helpful to the selection process.

<u>Mays</u>: He inquired as to whether a minimum number of candidates are recommended by OSBA.

<u>Delane:</u> He commented to Mr. Mays that OSBA would recommend 7-10 candidates but could be more or less depending upon the Board's wishes.

<u>Rocco</u>: She asked Mr. Delane if there was a drop-dead deadline for notifying OSBA if community members will be involved in the search process.

<u>Delane</u>: He stated March 14<sup>th</sup> is the proposed deadline for search parameters.

Wargo: She asked Mr. Delane how the Board should identify focus-group participants.

<u>Delane</u>: He recommended the Board consider an 'open-forum' style inviting as many participants as possible.

O'Malley: He asked Mr. Delane at what point in the process does OSBA research potential applicants from other districts' vacancies.

<u>Delane</u>: He indicated these types of applicants are immediately considered as part of the potential pool of candidates for Westlake.

<u>Beal</u>: He asked if interviews are staggered or held in one evening?

<u>Delane</u>: He indicated interviews are usually staggered.

O'Malley: He is concerned with the Easter holiday contained in the interview timeline.

O'Malley: He expressed concern that a residency requirement could limit candidates.

## \*Hearing of Public (15 minutes)

<u>Joe Marinucci</u>: He requested copies of the information distributed today by the search consultant. He asked how the Board would make its decision on community involvement. He indicated his preference is for the community to be involved in as much of the process as possible.

<u>Christie Wiedt</u>: She commented the Board might want to consider the CAC as a focus group. <u>Joanne Belzile</u>: She feels the most important part of the process is developing the "superintendent criteria." She would like the Board to give the community a sense of the Board's criteria for a new superintendent.

<u>Rocco</u>: She stated to the Board there would be no harm in including community people in the process from the beginning.

#### C. Board Items

<u>Wargo</u>: She suggested some tentative dates for the Arts Council Forum: February 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, 20<sup>th</sup> or 27<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Board</u>: The Board agreed they would all be in attendance for the Forum. Treasurer Pepera was directed to investigate whether a meeting notice needs to be issued or not.
