C. Superintendent's Report

Superintendent Keenan reported on the following:

- Music Boosters to host a Murder Mystery Dinner this Friday.
- District administration and staff in process of formulating new assessments.
- District to begin implementation of AIMS web.
- The school District was found to be in full compliance after a recent gifted program audit.
- WHS Design and Architect students won 10 out 10 awards at the Home and Garden Show.
- Deb Schrembeck, 7th Grade Language Arts teacher, provided an overview of the Language Arts standards and how this was addressed through the "Fairy Tale Project" which involved 132 students.
- Pam Griebel reported that some of our students will be involved in a distance learning project with students from France using SKYPE technology.

H. Board Items

Discussion:

<u>Winter</u>: Stated the Board would now consider exhibit H-2 in light of the fact that most in attendance were present for that item. She asked the Board if they had further comments with respect to the proposed resolution to place a 3.4 mill levy on the ballot in May to address the District's facility needs.

<u>Cross</u>: Stated for the record he has heard everything that people have said and will pledge to be respectful and courteous of everyone's opinions. He further stated that while his views may differ from others, he believes the Board still needs to work together to find a solution. He concluded by stating he cares about the community, wants to make a contribution, and is hopeful to have more open dialogue on this matter.

Mays: Indicated he respects Mr. Cross' opinion but would debate his statement about finding an acceptable solution in light of the fact the Board has already come to consensus on this matter. He asked Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Cross if they will support this issue if the majority of the Board says to move forward.

<u>Sullivan</u>: Indicated to Mr. Mays he will respect the will of the majority and will follow the policy manual on this matter. He further stated that he will answer questions from the public honestly, though, about his non-support of the issue.

<u>Winter</u>: In light of Board policy, she asked Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Cross to speak with the majority on this issue.

<u>Cross</u>: Stated that if the majority votes to support the issue, he will respect the will of the majority and only share why he voted "no" with others if they ask but make it clear that the will of the majority spoke.

<u>Mays</u>: Stated the whole purpose for putting the issue out there was to allow the taxpayers to have a voice in telling us what to do. He further stated the Board cannot be fiscally responsible until the voters take action to allow us to have those funds.

<u>Sullivan</u>: Stated to the Board he will not be working behind the scenes on this issue but won't promise anything regarding individual conversations he might have with people on this topic.

Winter: Once again asked Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Cross to support this issue.

<u>Rocco</u>: Asked Mr. Cross if he read the proposed resolution.

Cross: Indicated to Ms. Rocco he had read the resolution.

<u>Rocco</u>: Stated to Mr. Cross the resolution is very simple in that the Board had open meetings, that they had a vote, and that the majority decided it would be put on the ballot. She further stated to Mr. Cross he can't sit there and say he wants to work with the Board and serve the community, do the right thing, and follow the policies and still not vote yes on this issue.

Cross: Stated to Ms. Rocco he respectfully disagrees.

<u>Rocco</u>: Indicated to Mr. Cross he is wrong and that any person who takes the time to read this resolution will come to that same conclusion.

<u>Sullivan</u>: Commented on the accomplishment of the teachers, administration and volunteers with respect to the facilities process. He further stated that even though he does not agree with others, he would respect the majority decision to put this issue on the ballot, and in turn respect the right of the taxpayers to decide what would be the best thing to do.

Winter: Stated that the Board will need to continue to work together as a team on this issue.

<u>Keenan</u>: Stated the Board has not been tone-deaf to the community and the same data-driven process has been used over the last two years to gain input. He further stated that the process even included using a statistically based survey to a 95% degree level of confidence.

<u>Rocco</u>: Indicated that in the last 26 months, there were several alternatives discussed by our community including the 20/20 Committee, the four members of the Board present this evening and by the administration. She further stated that she wants the record to clearly show the Board has not received any alternatives from the two members of the Board who voted 'no' two weeks ago.

<u>Winter</u>: Indicated District school buildings are at the end of their lives, and it is outrageous for a member of this Board not to support this well thought out and researched plan that goes well beyond just patching our facilities.

<u>Keenan</u>: Indicated that Mr. Sullivan had previously made a recommendation for a PI levy and a lesser scale bond issue which had been reviewed by the experts and the community process. The experts and the community were in agreement that these were not viable solutions in light of the scope of the problem.

<u>Rocco</u>: Stated that the facility problems will not go away and need to be addressed. The money to address these problems will have to come from somewhere, and if not a bond issue, then cuts to our already tight budget. She further stated it would seem logical to first ask the taxpayers to support this issue prior to considering any cuts.

<u>Cross</u>: Stated that it is not the time for discussing alternatives, and the issue before the Board tonight is the \$84m facility question. He further stated he will respect the right of taxpayers to decide for themselves on this issue.

<u>Keenan</u>: Stated that the outcome of the levy will also ultimately inform the District as how to proceed on this issue.

President Winter declared a brief recess at 8:09 p.m. and resumed the meeting at 8:12 p.m.

*Hearing of Public (15 Minutes)

<u>Harry Applegate</u>: To Mr. Cross: He feels disrespected about the position he has taken on the bond issue and disagrees with his opinion that fiscal responsibility cannot be shown.

David Anghilante: Asked Ms. Winter when the Board would need the next operating levy.

<u>Winter</u>: Stated that based on our current forecast, the District would need to go for an operating levy in 2012.

<u>Cynthia Sabolich</u>: Indicated there needs to be more agendas available for the public, and that she supports the bond issue. She feels Mr. Cross ran a good campaign, clear, honest, open about his goals. She voted for Mr. Marinucci because he had four kids in the system, and that was important to her because of his basis of knowledge. She feels Ms. Rocco disrespects the electorate, feels she needs to apologize to Mr. Cross.

<u>Rocco</u>: Stated to Ms. Sabolich she will not apologize for her comments, and it is important that people on the Board respect the process that spanned over two years. She also commented that Mr. Cross even sat on those committees and never offered any alternatives. She further indicated to Ms. Sabolich that she respects her opinion and is grateful for her vote but can't sit back and let someone make statements that can't be substantiated. She finished her comment by stating that if we don't pass this bond issue, serious cuts will have to be made and can't see why anyone would not give the community members that option.

<u>Cynthia Sabolich</u>: Asked Ms. Winter how our schools have gotten so bad with buckets under roofs and kids in modular schools.

<u>Winter</u>: Responded to Ms. Sabolich that when money was tight, less funds were allocated to maintenance and repair and instead focus was placed on items directly impacting instruction. Over time, this type of reallocation of resources further widened the gap with the capital needs of the District. As a result, the school District now has a master plan to address our facility needs and that will incorporate a revenue stream to handle routine maintenance ensuring this issue does not happen again in the future.

<u>Keenan</u>: Explained to Ms. Sabolich that Westlake is not alone on this issue. Many surrounding schools are faced with the same problem and this is, in fact, a large reason why the Ohio Schools Facility Commission was founded a number of years ago. While we do not want to ask for an increase in anyone's taxes, this is the only viable way at this time the schools can raise enough capital to address its assets.

The Treasurer advised the Board that the notice requirements of Section 121.22 of the Revised Code and the implementing rules adopted by the Board pursuant thereto were complied with for the meeting.

Tom Mays moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLUTION NO. 10-34

A RESOLUTION DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH THE SUBMISSION OF THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT BONDS IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$84,056,066 TO THE ELECTORS OF THE WESTLAKE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, on January 11, 2010, this Board adopted a resolution declaring the necessity of submitting to the electors of this School District the question of the issuance of bonds (the Bonds) in the aggregate principal amount of \$84,056,066 and the levying of a tax to provide for the payment of the debt charges on the Bonds and any anticipatory securities at an election to be held in the School District on May 4, 2010, a copy of which resolution was certified to the Cuyahoga County Auditor; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Auditor has certified to this Board that the total tax valuation of the School District is \$1,364,439,460 and the estimated average annual property tax levy throughout the stated maximum maturity of the Bonds that would be required to pay the interest thereon and retire the principal thereof over 34 years is 3.4 mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, which amounts to 34 cents for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Westlake City School District, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. This Board determines to proceed with submitting to the electors pursuant to Section 133.18 of the Revised Code, at an election to be held on May 4, 2010, the question of issuing Bonds in the amount of \$84,056,066 for the purpose of constructing, renovating, remodeling, adding to, furnishing, equipping and otherwise improving school district buildings and facilities and acquiring, clearing and improving their sites, and levying a tax to pay the debt charges on the Bonds and on any notes issued in anticipation of the Bonds. The average annual property tax levy required to pay those debt charges has been estimated by the County Auditor to be 3.4 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 34 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation.

Section 2. The Treasurer of this Board is authorized and directed to certify to the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections not later than the close of business on Thursday, February 18, 2010: (i) a copy of the resolution adopted by this Board on January 11, 2010, declaring the necessity of the bond issue and providing for the principal of the Bonds to be paid over a maximum of thirty-four (34) years, which number of years is hereby certified to the Board of Elections; (ii) the certifications of the County Auditor as to the total tax valuation of the School District and the estimated average annual property tax levy; and (iii) a copy of this resolution. This Board hereby requests that the Board of Elections give notice of the election and prepare the necessary ballots and supplies for the election in accordance with law.

<u>Section 3</u>. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board and of any of its committees concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken, and all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were held, in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

Section 4. This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.

The Board furnishes transportation in compliance with State law. This fact does not relieve parents of students from the responsibility of supervision until such time as the student boards the vehicle and after the student leaves the vehicle at the end of the school day.

Students on a school vehicle are under the authority of, and directly responsible to, the vehicle driver. The driver has the authority to enforce the established regulations for vehicle conduct. Disorderly conduct or refusal to submit to the authority of the driver is sufficient reason for refusing transportation services or suspending transportation services to any student once proper procedures are followed.

The Board authorizes the Superintendent or other administrators to suspend a student from school bus riding privileges for a period not to exceed one school year. The only due process required is the student must receive notice of an intended bus riding suspension and an opportunity to appear before the Superintendent or other administrator before the suspension is imposed.

The Board's policy regarding suspension from school vehicle riding privileges must be posted in a central location in each school building and made available to students upon request.

After Board approval, Regulations regarding conduct on school vehicles, as well as general information about the school transportation program, are available to all parents and students.

The Board recognizes the need to provide equal educational opportunities for all students in the District. Therefore, if the inability to speak and understand the English language excludes a student from effective participation in the educational programs offered by the District, the District shall take appropriate action to rectify the English language deficiency in order to provide the student equal access to its programs. Students in a language minority or who have limited English proficiency are identified, assessed and provided appropriate services.

The Board directs the administration to develop and implement language instruction programs that:

- 1. appropriately identify language minority students;
- 2. determine the appropriate instructional environment for students with an English language deficiency and provide the appropriate instruction to limited English proficient students to assist them in gaining English language proficiency, as well as content knowledge, in reading/language arts and mathematics and
- 3. annually assess the English proficiency of students and monitor the their progress of students receiving English or bilingual instruction in order to determine their readiness for the mainstream classroom environment.

The District requires all students with limited English proficiency to be tested. Alternative assessments may be required and students must make yearly gains as defined by the adequate yearly progress indicator adopted by the State Board of Education and be at a proficient level in 12 years by the year 2014.

The Board directs the administration to develop a plan to comply with school choice and supplemental service sanctions.

Limited English proficient students who have been enrolled in U.S. schools for less than one full school year are exempt from **one administration of the reading/language arts assessment** the requirement to take the reading and writing proficiency or achievement tests administered to their grade levels. However, such students who choose to take these tests are permitted to do so. (Proficiency or achievement tests Assessments in math, science, and social studies are not exempt.)

The District provides parents with notice of and information regarding the instructional program as required by law. Parental involvement is encouraged and parents are regularly apprised of their child's progress.

When the superintendent receives information that a student of compulsory school age has withdrawn from school, the superintendent must, within two weeks after the withdrawal, notify the Registrar of Motor Vehicles and the county juvenile judge of the student's withdrawal from full-time enrollment or withdrawal from an approved program to obtain a diploma or its equivalent.

Notification **to the registrar of motor vehicles** is not necessary if a student has withdrawn **from school** because of a change of residence; **or** the student is **holding an age and schooling certificate** (**work permit**), **is regularly employed and** enrolled **part-time** in and attending, in accordance with District policy, an approved program to obtain a diploma or its equivalent. or if the student holds a full-time Age and Schooling Certificate and is regularly employed.

Notification to the Registrar of Motor Vehicles **must be given in a manner required by the registrar** and **notice to** the county juvenile judge must **be given in writing**. comply with Ohio and federal laws.

After receiving such information from the superintendent, the Registrar of Motor Vehicles is required to suspend the temporary instruction permit or driver's license of the student who is the subject of the notice. If a temporary permit or license has not been issued to that student, the Registrar is prohibited from issuing a temporary permit or a license. Any denial of driving privileges would remain in effect until the student reaches 18 or until the denial of driving privileges is terminated for another reason allowable under the Ohio State law.

In compliance with Ohio State law, a student whose driving privileges have been denied can file a petition seeking his/her reinstatement with the juvenile court in whose jurisdiction he/she resides.

The Board believes that a student's Students' school responsibilities are to take precedence over non-school-related jobs. However, the Board acknowledges that extenuating circumstances may surface when a student may need to forgo the traditional method of obtaining an education in order to work and provide support or care for himself/herself or his/her family members.

If **a** student needs to work while attending school, they are he/she is cautioned against assuming work commitments which interfere with their his/her studies and achievement in school. Opportunities for employment are may be provided through work-experience programs and as noted below other employers in accordance with the following provisions for obtaining age and schooling certificates.

Age and Schooling Certificates (Work Permits)

All students under the age of 18 must apply for a work permit in order to legally obtain paid employment. Students, ages 16 and 17, must have valid work permits for paid employment during the school year. Students, ages 14 and 15, must obtain valid work permits for employment at all times of the year.

In compliance with **State** law, the Superintendent/**designee** is responsible for processing requests for and issuing **all** work permits as necessary. **Students must provide all the documentation required by State law including, but not limited to, proof of age and physical fitness. Proof must also be provided identifying the potential employer as places of employment where minors can legally work. Employment must meet all legal requirements pertaining to jobs suitable for minors.**

In-School Employment

The Board may make available to students part-time and summer jobs may be open to students commensurate with their abilities and the needs of the school for student help District for student employees. The Board also authorizes the District to provide cooperative work-experience programs.

The Board approves appointments and establishes pay rates. These rates comply with requirements of the minimum wage law.

If the offender should be is a student, the person in charge should report the student to the appropriate principal. The administration cooperates in any prosecution pursuant to the criminal laws of the State and local ordinances.

Good Conduct and Sportsmanship

The Board recognizes the value of cocurricular and extracurricular activities in the educational process and the values that young people develop when they have the opportunity to participate in an organized activity outside of the classroom.

Students and adults participating in cocurricular and extracurricular activities are expected to demonstrate responsible behavior and good conduct. The Board encourages the development and promotion of sportsmanship in all phases of the educational process, including athletics and all other cocurricular and extracurricular activities. The Board encourages parents and other citizens of the District to visit classrooms to observe the work of the schools and to learn what the schools are doing. Visits should be scheduled with the teacher or building administrator, in advance, to avoid any unnecessary disruption to classroom instruction or activities.

To maintain the safety of students and staff and to ensure that no unauthorized persons enter buildings, all visitors entering a school must first report to the school main office when entering, to receive authorization to visit elsewhere in the building. (This policy does not apply when parents have been invited to a classroom or assembly program, graduation or athletic event.) (Authorization is not needed for scheduled school programs, assemblies, graduations and athletic events.)

All participants and spectators of school programs, assemblies, graduations and athletic events are expected to abide by all applicable laws, local ordinances, Board policies and District and building regulations pertaining to public conduct on District property.

Unauthorized persons are not permitted in school buildings or on school grounds. School principals and their designees are authorized to take appropriate action to prevent and remove, if necessary, unauthorized persons from entering District buildings, and loitering on the grounds, and/or creating disturbances anywhere on District property.
