1. Discussion of Permanent Improvement Levy

Mr. Finucane and Mr. Mays spoke about the extensive process the Audit and Finance committee used to determine and justify the need for a Permanent Improvement levy. They noted proceeds from the levy should be sufficient to meet the ongoing capital needs of the District and ensure taxpayer assets will be properly maintained. This concept is also consistent with an established Best Practice identified by the Governmental Financial Officers Association. After reviewing all of the data, the Committee is recommending a 1.0 mill PI levy be placed on the May 2015 ballot. Ms. Winter stated she is supportive of the recommendation but emphasized the need to educate the community on the issue. Mrs. Leszynski also voiced her support and indicated the recommendation shows the District is looking at the future as well. Mr. Falcone noted his support for the issue and reiterated this concept was originally derived from comments generated from our 20/20 community group.

RESOLUTION NO. 15-50

A RESOLUTION SUBMITTING THE QUESTION OF AN ADDITIONAL TAX LEVY FOR THE PURPOSE OF GENERAL PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS TO THE ELECTORS OF THE WESTLAKE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT, PURSUANT TO SECTION 5705.21 OF THE REVISED CODE.

WHEREAS, on January 7, 2015, this Board adopted a resolution, pursuant to Section 5705.03(B) of the Revised Code, declaring it necessary to levy an additional <u>1.0</u>-mill tax levy for general permanent improvements for a continuing period of time and requesting the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer to certify the total current tax valuation of the School District and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by that levy; and

WHEREAS, the Cuyahoga County Fiscal Officer subsequently certified that the total tax valuation of the District is \$1,365,267,880, and that the estimated property tax revenue to be produced by the aforementioned additional levy would be <u>\$1,365,267</u> annually during the life of the levy, assuming the tax valuation remains constant throughout the life of the levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Westlake City School District, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members of said Board concurring, that:

Section 1. It is hereby found, determined and declared that the amount of taxes which may be raised by the Board of Education of the Westlake City School District within the ten-mill limitation on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of this School District, and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of such limitation for the purpose of general permanent improvements in the amount of <u>1.0</u> mill for a continuing period of time.

Section 2. The question of an additional <u>1.0</u>-mill tax levy for the purpose of general permanent improvements for a continuing period of time, beginning with the tax list and duplicate for the year 2015, the proceeds of which levy first would be available to this Board in calendar year 2016, shall be submitted under the provisions of Section 5705.21 of the Revised Code to the electors of the Westlake City School District at

an election to be held therein on May 5, 2015, as authorized by law, and that election shall be held at the regular places of voting in this District as established by the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, or otherwise, within the times provided by law and shall be conducted, canvassed and certified in the manner provided by law.

Section 3. The form of the ballot to be cast at the election on the question of this tax levy shall be substantially as follows:

PROPOSED TAX LEVY WESTLAKE CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage.

An additional tax for the benefit of the Westlake City School District for the purpose of general permanent improvements at a rate not exceeding 1.0 mill for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to 10 cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation, for a continuing period of time, commencing in 2015, first due in calendar year 2016.

Section 4. The Treasurer of this Board is hereby authorized and directed to give or cause to be given notice of said election as provided by law.

Section 5. The Treasurer is hereby directed to certify a copy of this resolution and the resolution and County Fiscal Officer's certificate referred to in the preambles hereto, and deliver them to the Board of Elections of Cuyahoga County, Ohio, not later than the close of business on February 4, 2015.

Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and that all deliberations of this Board and of any of its committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.

Section 7. This resolution shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its adoption.
