- H. Director of Curriculum & Instruction Report

Ray Conti reported on the following District initiatives:

• Staff are working with Kent State to understand the new assessments related to the Ohio Graduation Test and learn how to integrate the assessments into their classrooms.

I. Board Items

<u>Wargo</u>: Inquired about the inaccurate information reported in the Plain Dealer today. She would like to discuss how the Board will respond to this issue.

<u>LeChaix</u>: Indicated a formal response may give additional unwanted credibility to author.

<u>Rocco</u>: People need to see both sides of the issue, and not only the inaccurate information that is being reported.

<u>Beal</u>: Wanted to know how the Board intends to address the evaluation of the superintendent in order to comply with its policy.

<u>Rocco</u>: Wanted to reiterate that all meetings of the Board have been open to the public and have addressed the setting of goals for the district, superintendent and treasurer.

<u>Beal</u>: Indicated current board policy regarding the evaluation of the superintendent should remain, and the Board should evaluate the superintendent in writing. He indicated the PD reporter should be contacted to correct the misstatement of the facts in the recent news article.

<u>Board</u>: All board members present agreed that the superintendent would be given a written evaluation this year, and the Board will continue this discussion at the April 2004 workshop. The discussion will center around the appropriate evaluation instrument and timeline for evaluation.

<u>LeChaix</u>: Suggested the Board issue a press release to clear up any misunderstandings surrounding the recent news article. The release should be prepared by the district's communication coordinator, be brief and state the facts.

<u>Wargo</u>: Would like the Board to make sure they publicize the good things happening in the district more frequently, such as the Continuous Improvement Plan.

<u>Beal</u>: What does the Board think about the proposed budget expenditure delays by the superintendent? Would like the Board to get input to the Superintendent as soon as possible.

<u>Rocco</u>: Wanted the Board to discuss and share their thoughts regarding the discipline policy regarding smoking.

<u>Wargo</u>: Indicated some other surrounding schools take a much stronger stance on smoking and have had some success.

<u>Superintendent</u>: Suggested a citation to the offenders which would require a court appearance. <u>Rocco</u>: Indicated student smoking on school grounds seems to be a continual problem, and the District administration needs to deal with the issue.

<u>Beal</u>: The Board seems to be in agreement that the offenders should receive a citation, and the administration must also notify parents and students of any change in this policy.

Beal: If possible, would like a summary debriefing the Mentor Schools' fiscal situation.

<u>Wargo</u>: Would like an update from WHS administration on the guidance department reorganization.

<u>LeChaix</u>: Suggested the Board receive a written report from the high school administration and then if needed, a presentation to the Board

<u>Wargo</u>: Feels the high school guidance department should be organizationally restructured.

K. *Meeting Open to Public (15 Minutes)

- Harry Applegate: Wanted to know if a student can be accepted to a college or university without passing the Ohio Graduation Test?
- Superintendent Costanza indicated it depended upon the particular institution's admission requirements.
- Harry Applegate: Will additional help be given to teachers to change their instructional methods? What about hiring a college level guidance department staff person at WHS?
- Superintendent Costanza indicated the staff has been given professional development opportunities to enhance their instructional methods in light of the new standards.
