B. Approval of Minutes

Board Discussion

<u>Winter</u>: She briefly discussed the format of the minutes in relation to current Board policy. <u>Sullivan</u>: He spoke about his internal request to include his statements from the January 4th, January 11th and January 25th meetings.

<u>Winter</u>: She discussed Board policy on verbatim submission of comments by board members. <u>Cross</u>: Stated he would like his statements from the January 11th and January 25th meetings relative to facilities be accepted into the record.

<u>Mays</u>: Stated he is worried about the cost and time factor in now providing for open-ended submissions of statements.

<u>Sullivan</u>: Stated he fully supports any member of the Board being permitted to submit a statement and finds the effort to exclude short statements from members as attachments troubling.

<u>Winter</u>: Indicated to Mr. Sullivan it is not the intention to exclude any member's comments but rather an effort to follow current policy on this matter which states that minutes should be a summary of what happens at the meeting. She further stated that if a change in policy is required, it would need to come before the Board, and that the statements in question were not verbatim in some cases, which poses another issue. She further commented this topic begs the question of whether we are about the kids or is it an issue about Board members being perceived in the right way.

Sullivan: Stated he does not agree with Ms. Winter's comment.

<u>Winter</u>: Indicated the District has a vehicle in place (tape recordings) to capture the actions and general discussion of the Board. She asked Mr. Pepera if it has been a past practice of the members of the Board to submit prepared statements.

<u>Pepera</u>: Stated it has not been past practice to submit verbatim statements, and instead a member of the Board has simply requested their brief comment, not statement, be placed 'on the record'

<u>Cross</u>: Indicated 'for the record' he does not believe the minutes or notes accurately reflected his sentiments or feelings relative to the facilities issue in as much as his words he read at the meeting, which now have been submitted to the Treasurer. He further stated he wants his remarks made at those meetings to be placed into the written record.

<u>Sullivan</u>: Stated he does not believe the minutes of January 4th, 11th, and 25th accurately reflect his statements and sentiments, and there is no reason or policy to keep them out and wants them to also be placed on the facilities website.

<u>Rocco</u>: Indicated the Board is required by policy to speak with one voice

<u>Winter</u>: Stated to Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Cross the tape is intended to capture all the verbatim detail of the meeting, and it seems disproportionate that the two minority votes on this issue want their specific comments in print.

<u>Mays</u>: Indicated to Mr. Sullivan and Mr. Cross that their request to place their minority views on our website violates our policy which states we speak as one voice.
