Superintendent Keenan reported on the following:

- 1. Developing alternate assessments and preparing for the OGT Test. A 'late start' will be implemented for these students.
- 2. The District received a Middle School grant for STEM. The grant totaled \$550,000 providing additional technology, professional development and instruction in the areas of science, technology, engineering and math.
- 3. Two teachers were awarded grants from Best Buy: \$10,000 to Kathy Bartos and \$2,000 to Scott Kutz.
- 4. Martha Holden Jennings grant of \$2,700 was awarded to Parkside Intermediate (Mimi Verdone and Mary Beth Opron were responsible for obtaining this grant).
- 5. A community forum on recent substance abuse issues was a success. Many other local communities were also in attendance.
- 6. The District will implement ALERTNOW to provide instant messages/calls to parents and staff.
- 7. Updated the Board on the national beef recall. Dr. Keenan indicated the recall was classified as a "Remote possibility" status, and any affected cases of beef were removed from inventory.
- 8. Founder's Day (PTA) was well attended. Pam Griebel was recognized as "Educator of the Year."
- 9. The Red Brick Memo of Understanding and lease agreement is tentatively slated for approval at the next board meeting.
