*Hearing of Public (15 Minutes) Agenda Items

Kelsey Wermer, teacher, stated her comments in the Board Notes from the previous board meeting were inaccurate. She then spoke about the lack of communication from the leadership of the District.

David Berkheimer, staff member, read a prepared statement about his history in Westlake. He made comments about the proposed staff appreciation resolution and the importance of recognizing and respecting staff.

Michael Kula, teacher, spoke about the lack of resources for teachers. He questioned why teachers weren't reimbursed for additional schooling costs and asked the Board to reprioritize its spending toward the teachers instead of school buildings.

Jennifer Williams, teacher, spoke about her history in the District and the change in culture. She questioned the #TreasurerTuesday references on the website and instead would like to see #TeacherTuesday references.

Patrick McMorrow, teacher, read a prepared statement about District culture and climate. President Winter cautioned Mr. McMorrow and others about their comments, and that they should refrain from naming individual staff members.

Patrick McMorrow then continued his remarks focusing on the treatment of employees by staff at the board office.

Hearing of the Public (15 Minutes)

Russ Ezolt, resident, commented about recent newspaper articles discussing the issue of teacher pay in Westlake and referenced an average teacher salary statistic he obtained from the Ohio Department of Education. He then spoke about comments made by a staff member with respect to his experience with the Strongsville teacher strike.

Kathy Schultz, parent, spoke about what the schools mean to her and her children, and stated she supports the teachers. She requested the Board consider a compromise.

Amy Havelka, PTA President, read a prepared statement which indicated the neutrality stance of the PTA with respect to the current labor situation at the District.

Kelly Kuns, teacher, spoke about the influences that teachers have on students and the need to retain highly qualified, highly respected and well paid teachers. She then spoke about the lack of support and feeling under appreciated.

Kelly Falcone, resident, spoke about her support for the school system and competitive salaries for teachers.

Carol Burns, parent, spoke about supporting our schools and teachers.

Lauren Falcone, parent, commented about her support for the school system, including the teachers, but mentioned she is extremely disappointed with the tactics the Union has been using.

Lela Bakos, teacher, spoke about an award Allison Lawrence recently received (Crystal Apple Award). LaVonne Szafranski, teacher, spoke about her career at Westlake, concessions provided by teachers, the lack of salary increases and respect toward teachers.

Jessica Molenaar, teacher, spoke about her Westlake career and past concessions given by teachers. She mentioned some issues that are causing culture and climate changes within the District.

Dina Abugroon, parent, spoke in support of the District and mentioned a lack of information from the District on the struggle of the teachers. She noted respect for the Board but asked them to consider a compromise with the teachers.

Diane Smith, parent, shared her personal story and spoke in support of the teachers.

Sue Weitzel, teacher, made a comparison to the current climate in the Westlake City School District to a classroom experience.

Patrick McMorrow, teacher, wanted to clarify his recollection of the timing/cancellation of past negotiation sessions. He then personally invited members of the Board to attend the next negotiation session on Friday.

Loretta Tindall, teacher, read a prepared statement about District stakeholders and its negotiation team. She made claims regarding the negotiating team and their withholding of information. She invited members of the Board to attend the next negotiation session on Friday.

Diane Seville, parent, asked a question about the decreases in teacher pay and lack of resources. She mentioned she is also concerned about the communication from the District to parents.

Julie McCallister, resident and local realtor, stated she is saddened by the path Westlake it on and would like the Board to consider the issue of saying no to the teachers and how this decision might impact local housing values.

E. Board Items and Comments

President Winter congratulated CFO/Treasurer Mark Pepera on his tenure at Westlake and wished him well with his new job opportunity. She noted K-12 Consulting will work on the CFO search and are hopeful to have a new treasurer in place by the end of June.

Mr. Kraft acknowledged Superintendent Palmer's service to the District and also commented on Allison Lawrence's recent award. He noted the Board supports its OAPSE and WTA bargaining units but also understands its financial responsibilities.

Mr. Finucane thanked members of the audience for their comments and spoke about similar reasons he chose to live in Westlake. He then mentioned the importance of community and good communication.

Mrs. Leszynski spoke about the importance for the Board to listen to the community and mentioned the abundant communication efforts that have been made by the District. She then asked Mr. Palmer to elaborate on a recent student incident which occurred at WHS.

Superintendent Palmer noted the District followed all of the necessary protocols in that matter but also stressed the continual need to improve District communications.

Dr. Stoll noted all groups are vested in the process and commented on the importance for the Board to balance their efforts.

President Winter noted communication is important and everyone has a role. The Board's role is to ensure the financial stability for the District while attempting to address all stakeholder needs keeping students the number one priority.
