RESOLUTION NO. 12-242

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE WESTLAKE ATHLETIC DEVELOPMENT FOUNDATION RELATING TO FUNDRAISING EFFORTS IN SUPPORT OF AN ARTIFICIAL TURF FIELD PROJECT.

WHEREAS, the Westlake Athletic Development Foundation (the "Foundation"), a [private, not-for-profit entity, recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and classified as a public charity under Section 509(a)(2) of the Code], has informed the Board that it intends to seek to raise funds for the acquisition and installation of an artificial turf field at the Westlake High School stadium; and

WHEREAS, part of the Foundation's fundraising plan includes recognition of donations made at or above specified levels in specified ways, as set forth in <u>Exhibit A</u> attached to this resolution (the "Donor Recognition Proposal"), incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Board, with appreciation for the generous efforts of the Foundation, desires to formalize certain matters relating to the Donor Recognition Proposal;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Westlake City School District, County of Cuyahoga, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. To formalize certain matters relating to the Foundation's Donor Recognition Proposal, the Board hereby approves the Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") in substantially the form attached as Exhibit B to this resolution. The Superintendent and Treasurer are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the MOU, together with any necessary changes in furtherance of the best interests of the School District, and to take any and all other actions that may be necessary or desirable to effectuate the intent of this resolution and the MOU. Any expenditures and transfers of donated funds consistent with this resolution and the MOU are hereby authorized. This Board affirms and ratifies prior actions related thereto and consistent therewith.

Section 2. EXHIBIT B

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding (the "MOU") is entered into as of the date of last signature hereof, by and between the Board of Education of the Westlake City School District, Ohio (the "District") and the Westlake Athletic Development Foundation (the "Foundation"), a [private, not-for-profit entity, currently recognized by the Internal Revenue Service as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") and classified as a public charity under Section 509(a)(2) of the Code], to formalize certain matters relating to Foundation's fundraising plan in support of an artificial turf field at the Westlake High School stadium, a District facility (the "Artificial Turf Project").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Foundation is embarking on a campaign to raise funds for the Artificial Turf Project; and

WHEREAS, the Foundation's fundraising plan for the Artificial Turf Project includes recognition of donations made at or above specified levels in specified ways (the "Recognitions"), as set forth in Addendum A attached hereto (the "Donor Recognition Proposal"); and

WHEREAS, some or all of the Recognitions ultimately require District approval; and

WHEREAS, the District appreciates the effort being undertaken by the Foundation to solicit contributions in support of the Artificial Turf Project, recognizes the benefits of the Artificial Turf Project to the physical educational experience of the District's students, the District's athletic program, and the District's finances, and desires to work cooperatively with the Foundation in its effort;

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by the parties, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1. The District acknowledges that the donation thresholds established in the Donor Recognition Proposal exceed the respective values of the Recognitions and thus, upon receipt of in-kind or cash donations in support of the Artificial Turf Project from the Foundation equal to or in excess of said thresholds, the District will, with the thanks of the District to the donors and the Foundation, provide concomitant Recognitions to the donors as itemized by the Foundation, provided that the form and content of any Recognitions (beyond that specifically described in Addendum A) involving displays on District property shall be subject to District approval in its sole discretion. The District will acknowledge and accept all donations from the Foundation by resolution. The District shall be the sole owner of the items and funds donated to it by the Foundation upon such acceptance. Donated funds received from the Foundation, net of any cost of the associated Recognitions, shall be deposited ultimately in a fund, or account within an appropriate fund, for the purpose of acquiring and constructing the Artificial Turf Project. The Treasurer shall take whatever actions may be necessary to create such a fund or account, and to otherwise properly account for the crediting, transfer, deposit, and expenditure of such donated funds and any associated Recognitions in accordance with this MOU. The Foundation will be solely responsible for determining the tax-deductibility of any particular donation and conveying that determination to individual donors; the District agrees to cooperate with the Foundation in the Foundation's exercise of such responsibilities.

Section 2. Each party represents that: (i) it has the authority to execute and deliver the MOU; (ii) its governing body has taken all requisite action to approve the execution and delivery of the MOU; and (iii) the Superintendent and Treasurer of the Board of Education of the District, and the President of the Foundation, are authorized to take any and all actions that may be necessary to effectuate the transactions contemplated by this MOU.

Section 3. This MOU shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the District and the Foundation and their respective successors and assigns. This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the parties.

Section 4. The parties expressly agree that this MOU may not be modified without the written consent of each party.

Section 5. This MOU may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed to be an original. All signatures need not be made on the same signature page.
