<u>Christie Wiedt</u>: She encourages the Board to investigate potential cuts based upon a possible levy failure in November 2005 or May 2006 and to get the information out to the community. <u>Superintendent Costanza</u>: Commented on the response from Ohio School Boards Association (OSBA) regarding the conflict of interest policy. He further explained the inquiry asked the following questions:

- 1. Was our policy recommended by OSBA? Yes.
- 2. Was OSBA's policy expanding the scope of ORC? No.

<u>Wargo</u>: Does the Board want to amend the policy to reflect statutory language? Superintendent Costanza handed out a draft of a revised policy for consideration.

Beal: He supports the policy change as submitted by the Superintendent.

Wargo: She supports the revised policy change as submitted by the Superintendent.

O'Malley: He would support the policy change if the language stayed the same, but add verbiage at the end, "as defined and limited by ORC 3313.13."

<u>Wargo</u>: Based upon consensus from the Board, she deemed the draft policy provided by the Superintendent to be considered a "first reading" with appropriate action to be taken at a later meeting.

D. Work Session

1. Levy Discussion

Wargo: Would like to hear from Board members on this topic.

O'Malley: Wants to get input from others on this topic and input from the new Board member. He is not prepared to discuss this matter other than the amount of a potential levy

discussed at the last board meeting. He always thought the May 2006 timeframe was best but was willing to consider November 2005.

<u>Wargo</u>: To Mr. O'Malley: Will you support the majority if it is agreed to go on the May 2006 ballot?

O'Malley: Yes, that is something I will consider.

O'Malley: If I am elected mayor, I don't think you will need a levy.

Beal: How can you say we don't need a levy?

O'Malley: He doesn't believe there is a statute that bars a municipality from donating money to the schools. He commented that an income tax sharing agreement similar to Green Local Schools could be used to fund the schools instead of a levy.

<u>Rocco</u>: How could this generate enough money? Our budget is over \$40M a year, and collective bargaining is a consideration.

O'Malley: May 2006 is a better time. A unanimous vote is important in putting a levy on the ballot.

<u>Mays</u>: Is the City of Green an agreement between the city and the schools or is it governed by a vote of the people?

O'Malley: It was an agreement negotiated between the city and the schools. Other examples are Hudson and Akron. Green Local was an imposed additional income tax.

<u>Rocco</u>: Usually fixed income taxpayers will not support an income tax.

O'Malley: Westlake has a full tax credit, which would make it more palatable.

<u>Rocco</u>: It is important for the Board to work together. She is worried about the political climate in November. The Board needs to make decisions now to limit expenses if they delay and put an issue on the May 2006 ballot.

<u>Wargo</u>: I support Ms. Rocco's comments and the pursuit of an issue in May. The urgency is also there.

<u>Beal</u>: He commented that financially, we can hold off till May 2006, but he is in favor of additional cost savings measures and examining the Bradley Road property. He also indicated there is not enough time available prior to the November levy to run a campaign. In addition, our message will be difficult to get across in November. He is in favor of May. <u>Mays</u>: All five board members need to be on board. The political climate will be difficult in November. He supports a May 2006 initiative.

<u>Beal</u>: The Board needs to support the ground-roots effort already underway to raise funds for the levy campaign.
