Hearing of Public (15 Minutes) Agenda Items – None.

A. Work Session

- 1. General Fund 2004-2005 Appropriations (Draft)
 - Treasurer Pepera distributed a draft of the appropriations to the Board.
- 2. Review Financial Situation
 - Treasurer Pepera reviewed the District's current financial situation.

<u>Wargo</u>: Expressed concern about how the District will manage and monitor the use of the Performing Arts Center facility.

O'Malley: At some point, the District needs to minimize the purchase of busses to control costs.

<u>Beal</u>: In contemplating any budget reduction, the Board needs to consider the historical conservative nature of the appropriation measure.

<u>O'Malley</u>: Would like the Board to reduce the appropriation measure, and then, at a later date, approve any additional amounts required for permanent improvement needs.

<u>Beal</u>: The Board always has the authority to amend the appropriations if needed. <u>LeChaix</u>: The fundamental issue is the Board's ability to minimize expenditures and control programmatic expenses. He indicated this Board should not push any expenses onto future Boards.

O'Malley: The Board needs to build its case for a levy campaign. They can accomplish this by further tightening expenses.

<u>Wargo</u>: Indicated the current administration has a proven track record of not spending dollars frivolously.

<u>Rocco</u>: Indicated the Board should concentrate more on 83% of the budget which is encompassed by personnel and fringes costs.

<u>LeChaix</u>: If the Board reduces the appropriations, they need to be accountable for the cuts or reductions they make.

<u>Beal</u>: Essentially, there are two options: The Board can reduce the appropriations and take a formal stance, or they can appropriate the budget and rely on the administration not to spend.

<u>Board Consensus</u>: The Board unanimously directed the superintendent and treasurer to cut an additional \$500,000 out of the proposed appropriation measure and report the details of this adjustment at the September 16, 2004 meeting.

<u>Wargo</u>: Could the Board's decision to modify the appropriations impact school programs?

O'Malley: Now is the time for the Board to set policy as it relates to District spending.

Financial Discussion:

<u>LeChaix</u>: In order for the Board to convey a unified message, a unanimous vote for an operating initiative is needed.

<u>Beal</u>: Two possible levy campaign options are: (1) utilize a "JIT" (just in time) strategy, or (2) agree to go on the ballot in May 2005 and develop a plan to expedite District communication public relations. In addition, he suggests the Board seek some outside professional communication assistance.

<u>Board Direction</u>: The Board would like the superintendent to solicit proposals from vendors to help the District improve its public relations and develop a community survey.

Rocco: Do we need a levy timeline for planning and strategy purposes?
