- E. CAC Reports CAC Project Presentation
  - Garn Anderson provided an overview of the proposed 2007-08 CAC projects. He noted the projects are as follows:
    - 1. To design a formal CAC communications feedback process for the Westlake Board of Education.
    - 2. To research the potential implications for Westlake's educational curriculum for the 21<sup>st</sup> Century and beyond, and assess the feasibility of teaching financial responsibility at Westlake Schools.
    - 3. To evaluate Westlake's "gifted" and "honors" program delivery and coordination and determine whether Westlake has the right number and type of Advanced Placement (AP) classes and current honors/weighted classes.
    - 4. To explore possible funding alternatives "pay to play," "sponsorships," "financial gifts," and "other" revenue enhancement mechanisms.
    - 5. To determine Westlake's formal policies concerning the use of parents, chaperones, and other adults at school-sponsored events.
    - 6. To review Westlake's current communication program not only between schools and parents but between the schools and community "content of communications as well as the mode of communications."

<u>Rocco</u>: Didn't the CAC incorporate the topic of communications in a previous year's project?

<u>Marinucci</u>: Would the sponsorship project include District athletics? <u>Wargo</u>: Stated the Board is in agreement to have the CAC proceed forward with the above-stated projects.

Dave Puffer reported on the following District projects:

- The Hilliard Library has been refurbished due to the flood over the summer.
- A punch list for the Holly Lane roof replacement was developed.
- The Science Lab renovation at the high school is complete.

- The District is reviewing camera locations and security procedures.
- The point-of-sale (POS) system installation at all school cafeterias is complete.
- Bus stops are being reviewed by the transportation director.
- Technology Department projects are being finalized.

O'Malley: What is the capacity of our email server?

<u>Puffer</u>: Indicated he did not know the exact answer, but can check with the Technology Coordinator.

- I. Board Items

<u>Mays</u>: The Board should consider, once again, offering a lease arrangement to the City for recreational use of the Bradley Road property. Mike Rump, Director for the Westlake Recreation Department, has stated the City currently requires one-half of the property for recreational purposes.

<u>Rocco</u>: Didn't we (the Board) already offer a lease to the City in 2002?

Mays: Yes, but some of their requirements appear to have changed.

<u>O'Malley</u>: The discussion between the City and the Schools surrounding a lease needs to change regarding the Bradley Road property. The Board should consider offering another lease arrangement.

<u>Rocco</u>: She seems to recall the lease concept was used as a tool for a political argument. <u>Marinucci</u>: He believes the decision by the Board of Elections today provides an opportunity for both parties to revisit this issue.

<u>Rocco</u>: We currently have a draft of a lease agreement. Shouldn't we just dust it off and only revise it if the terms of the agreement are to change?

<u>Marinucci</u>: He would like to discuss this matter with legal counsel prior to providing input on the draft agreement and also prior to discussion with the City.

<u>Rocco</u>: We don't need to reinvent the agreement, just revisit.

<u>O'Malley</u>: He wants to move the process forward and indicated the District's attorney should evaluate the lease specifically as it relates to price and applicable recapture provision(s).

<u>Rocco</u>: She indicated a lease agreement was already drafted, reviewed and approved by the former school board.

<u>O'Malley</u>: He stated the District should start with the two original lease agreements and have the Board attorney review and then discuss with the Board.

<u>Rocco</u>: We shouldn't spend money on attorneys to revisit this issue.

<u>Mays</u>: The Board previously discussed and agreed to use an attorney to handle negotiations on this issue.

<u>Wargo</u>: She commented to Ms. Rocco that she believes it is not appropriate for her to discuss this issue.

President D'Ettorre Wargo declared a brief recess at 6:38 p.m. for Board pictures and resumed the meeting at 6:40 p.m.
