G. Director of Business Affairs Report

Gary Slocum reported on the following District projects:

- District busses are arriving on time despite heavy road construction in the community.
- Request for changes in bus stops are being reviewed and processed by the Transportation Department.
- The profitability of the District's food service operation will be analyzed.
- Slocum and Conti are chairing the Children Wellness Committee.
- The gas leak at the high school has been safely secured and will be repaired shortly.
- Indicated there are still concerns regarding the Dover parking lot.

H. Director of Curriculum & Instruction Report

Ray Conti reported on the following District initiatives:

- The District will have student participation on the Children Wellness Committee.
- The administration of the 3rd grade achievement test is upcoming in October.
- The District will be focusing on education standards in the near future.

I. Board Items

1. Resolution to Approve Appointment of Porter Public Library Trustee Exhibit I-1

<u>Costanza</u>: Briefed the Board on the middle school athletic team participation issue. He indicated some member schools are having difficulty either financially or logistically in fielding teams.

<u>Newman</u>: Spoke about the history of having two teams in the SWC and the difficulty in trying to schedule games for two middle school teams due to the new makeup of the conference.

<u>Mays</u>: Wants to know if seven games are better than no games. If kids are cut, will we ever get them back?

O'Malley: What about playing a CYO team?

Newman: CYO teams are not permitted to play OHSAA-designated teams.

Mays: What about Lutheran teams?

Wargo: Is participation more important than competition?

O'Malley: He's not sure the problem will be resolved by increasing the roster. He feels participation is most important.

Mays: Seven games are better than none although the quality of play might diminish with a second team.

Beal: What about finding coaches? What about the financial implications?

Wargo: I am pro inclusiveness.

Beal: Maybe we should try fielding two teams on a one-year trial basis.

Board: Agrees the District should proceed with two teams: one conference team and one non-conference team.

Beal: Asked Treasurer Pepera if any response has been received on the income tax agreement?

Pepera: No.

Mays: Did we submit a public records request to the City for the Rec Center appraisal?

Pepera: Yes.

J. *Meeting Open to Public (15 Minutes)

Jennifer Riley: The District should consider evening the athletic schedules out. Also, wouldn't two coaches already be in the budget?

Joseph Eynon: He's a student at CSU and asked for clarification about comments at meeting about student wellness.

Kelly Bador: The decision to exclude the other middle school volleyball team earlier in the season was not consistent with the Board's recent decision to include two teams.

Susan Dodge: The District might want to solicit coaches for their input.

Dodge: There is once again a concern about the Dover parking lot.

Dodge: Per the Sun Herald, the Bradley Road property was quoted to be valued at \$5M. Per Ken Pendergast at the Sun Herald, the \$5M figure came from Joe O'Malley.

O'Malley: Mr. Pendergast was referring to a comment I made in May.

Dodge: To Mr. O'Malley: Has your opinion changed on the \$5M value?

O'Malley: I think appraisals can vary greatly. I stand by the figure. I made no statements to the paper with respect to the recent negotiations. I think the acreage is worth \$125,000/acre.

Dodge: What about diminishing value for the wetlands?

O'Malley: Wetlands is not as much of an issue because the City is using the land for a park.

Beal: The District did update the previous wetlands assessment. I don't think the land is worth \$125K/acre.

O'Malley: I would pay \$125,000 per acre if I were Mayor.
