#### 2. OSBA

Mr. Mays provided a recap of the OSBA conference held in Columbus. He further discussed the negative attributes of HB 136 and the potential for corrections to the biennial budget. Dr. Keenan then discussed and asked the Board for their feedback on full-day kindergarten for the 2012-13 school year. Mr. Mays responded he is in favor of providing full-day kindergarten and likes the idea of adding an additional tuition tier to help offset some of the hardship situations experienced by parents this year. Ms. Rocco indicated she is in favor of the full-day program to be operated in the same manner as the 2011-12 school year. Mr. Cross stated that in light of the District's financial situation he would not support an additional tuition eligibility tier. Instead, he suggested the District consider a spending reduction plan. Mr. Sullivan then asked when this matter would come for a vote. Dr. Keenan indicated he would like to have an answer from the Board by December. Mr. Sullivan stated he wants to support these initiatives, but needs to clearly understand the financial implication on the budget. Ms. Winter asked Dr. Keenan how the District will measure the performance of the full-day versus the half-day kindergarten programs. Dr. Keenan indicated that research supports full-day kindergarten, but there is no quantitative measure yet available. Ms. Rocco then asked Mr. Cross about his opinion on providing a full-day kindergarten program. Mr. Cross indicated he has additional questions but would not support an additional tier to the tuition scale. Mr. Sullivan stated the frustration seems to stem from the relationship between the size of the budget and the inability to add programs due to financial constraints. Ms. Rocco stated that she would like to hear other members' views on this topic so the group can then answer the Superintendent's question. Mr. Mays indicated the Board needs to provide Dr. Keenan with some focus or recommendation on whether to continue with full-day kindergarten or not. Dr. Keenan responded that the forecast already adopted by the Board has utilized the assumption that the tuition requirement will be eliminated in FY13, and that he is just trying to offer alternative options and then be able to timely communicate to parents. Mr. Cross indicated he prefers full-day kindergarten without tuition but understands the financial issues. He further stated he does not support adding an additional tier option and the Board should instead consider alternative budget cost reductions. Dr. Keenan then asked Mr. Cross for clarity purposes if he supports full-day kindergarten without adding an additional tuition tier. Mr. Cross responded by saving "yes." Mr. Mays asked Mr. Sullivan if he supports the status-quo full-day kindergarten program. Mr. Sullivan indicated he does not want to answer that question but would not change the current program. Ms. Winter and Mr. Mays indicated they support the full-day kindergarten program with the additional tuition tier. Dr. Keenan indicated that he would take the feedback he has received and come back to the Board with a proposal in December. Mr. Cross concluded in asking Dr. Keenan to provide numbers to his recommendation.
