Mr. Cross expressed a concern about the lack of information and timeliness of the bid information being approved. Dr. Keenan indicated he had previously communicated to the Board the Lee Burneson Middle School bids were higher than expected, and therefore the District opted to wait to award those bids until the High School bids were received. Mr. Cross then inquired as to why the middle school electrical bid was thrown out. Dr. Keenan noted the contractor requested the withdrawal due to a clerical error. Mr. Cross wanted to know why the second lowest contractor wasn't awarded the bid. Dr. Keenan explained the District has a right to reject a bid, but if it does, it

must then reject all the bids for that particular trade and rebid the work. Mr. Cross wanted to know why the contractors wouldn't rebid with the same numbers. Mr. Teitenberg explained that the District was hoping for better coverage from contractors thereby creating a more competitive environment.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING H.B. 136

WHEREAS, the Ohio House of Representative is currently considering legislation that would significantly expand the availability of vouchers for students to attend private or parochial schools; and

WHEREAS, this legislation would grant vouchers to any public school student in Ohio to request and be granted a voucher, subject only to a family income standard of \$95,000 or less; and

WHEREAS, such vouchers would be granted without regard to the academic performance of the public school that the student is assigned to attend; and

WHEREAS, the bill provides that students already enrolled in private or parochial schools would be eligible for such vouchers; and

WHEREAS, students receiving vouchers would be able to retain any excess funds in those instances where the cost of tuition is less than the value of the voucher for use in any private school or college in Ohio; and

WHEREAS, the operation of the proposed program would take dollars directly from the already financially beleaguered local public school districts resulting in fewer resources for the education of the remaining students;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Westlake Board of Education does hereby express its opposition to this legislation, HB 136 School Choice; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Westlake Board of Education expresses its opposition to any legislation that seeks to transfer public dollars to support private education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer be directed to spread this resolution upon the minutes of the Board of Education and that copies of the resolution be forwarded to members of the Ohio House of Representatives.

Board Discussion:

Treasurer Pepera briefed the Board on the issues surrounding language contained in HB136 and the negative impact it would have on the District. Mr. Cross asked Mr. Pepera what the total dollar impact to our District would be if the bill were to pass today. Mr. Pepera estimated just under \$2m. Mr. Cross stated that despite his personal belief in free market and free choice, he will support this resolution. He further stated he believes it's hypocritical to vote on this resolution and send this to the Columbus while members on the Board have children in private or parochial schools. Ms. Winter stated that regardless of belief in choice, it is bad legislation to create two systems for taxpayers to fund, and the District needs to protect its resources. She stated there are flaws with this bill and fully

supports the resolution. Ms. Rocco stated that private schools already receive more money on a per pupil basis than public schools and aren't held to the same standards. She stated she will support the resolution. Mr. Mays indicated he will also support the resolution for the same reasons as stated.
