The Key Features of the English Language Arts Standards are integrated into daily lessons.

Quarterly Grades include the following:

*Reading: The instructional focus is text complexity and the growth of comprehension in literature and non-fiction texts. Students will respond to text dependent questions using specific evidence from their reading.

*Writing: In third and fourth grades, students are asked to respond to text in narrative and opinion pieces based on claims and evidence from sources.

Speaking and Listening: Students will not only be expected to refine presentation skills, but to collaborate with one another and to integrate information from a variety of sources, evaluate what they hear, use media and visual displays effectively, and adapt speech to context and task.

Language: These standards include the essential "rules" of standard written and spoken English, but more deeply attend to "craft" - "why or how authors use language to communicate ideas". The vocabulary standards focus on understanding words and phrases, their relationships and the reasons why certain vocabulary is used, and how effective it can be in communicating the theme or information in text.

The mathematical practices of modeling, strategy, precision, structure, reasoning abstractly and quantitatively, perseverance in problemsolving and constructing variable mathematical arguments are woven throughout daily lessons. Quarterly grades reflect an integrated, scaffolded approach to rigorous math instruction.

*Upon entering fourth grade, students should have a first understanding and fluency with basic facts. This is essential in higher level problem-solving which requires fluency so that students can concentrate on the concepts rather than simple computation.

*In fourth grade, students develop an understanding of multi-digit multiplication and develop an understanding of dividing to find quotients involving multi-digit dividends.

*Students continue to work on understanding fraction equivalence, addition and subtraction of fractions with like denominators, and multiplication of fractions by whole numbers. Knowledge of fractions is an essential skill to prepare for algebra in the later grades.

*In geometry, fourth grade students are expected to understand that geometric figures can be analyzed and classified based on their properties such as parallel, perpendicular, angle measures, and symmetry.

Semester grades will address concepts within the theme below.

Heat and electrical energy are forms of energy that can be transferred from one location to another. Matter has properties that allow the transfer of heat and electrical energy. Heating and cooling affect the weathering of Earth's surface and Earth's past environments. The processes that shape the Earth's surface and the fossil evidence found can help decode Earth's history. The theme is explored through earth science (Earth's surface), physical science (Electricity, Heat and Matter), and life science (Earth's Living History).
